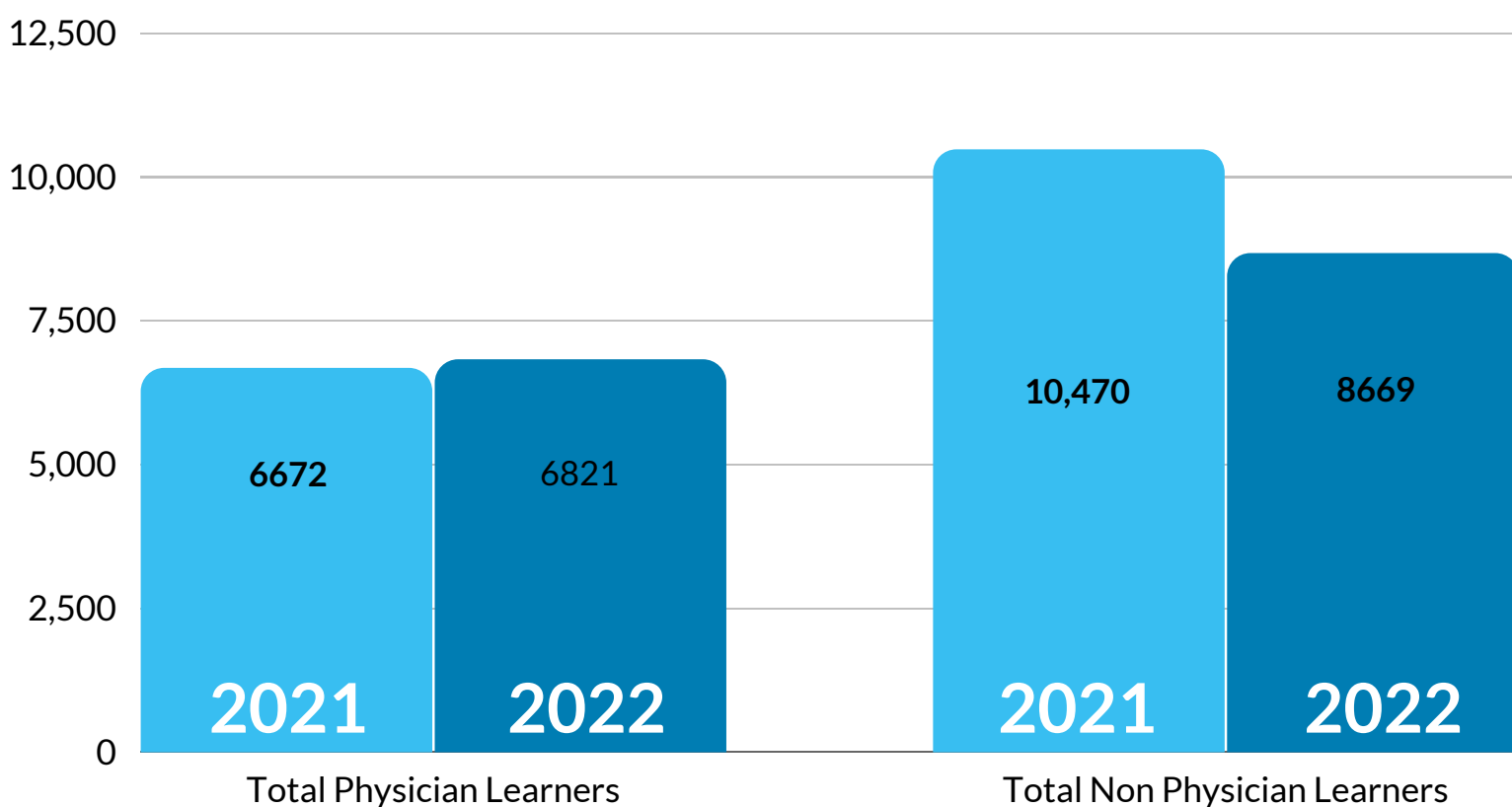
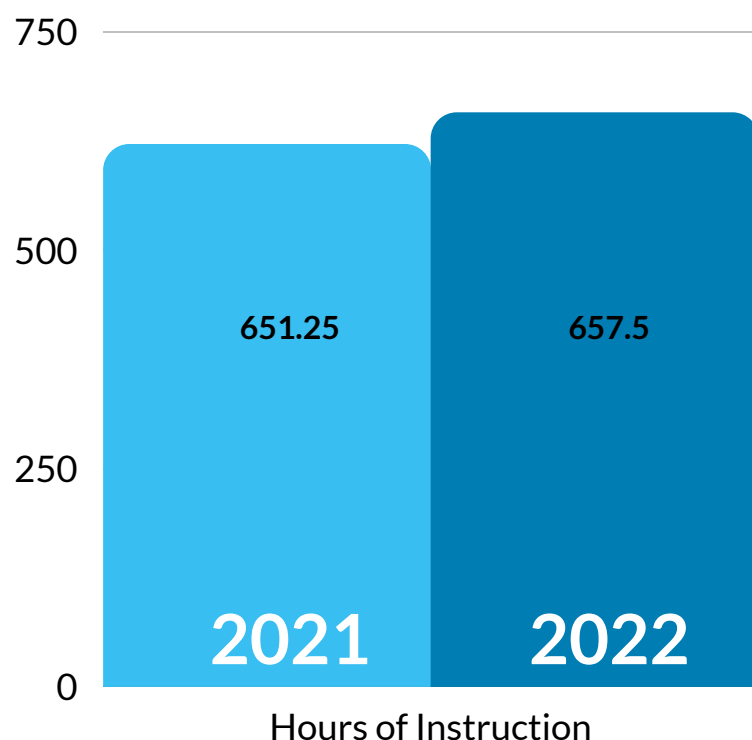

*We experienced fluctuations in participation and overall credits awarded due to activity pauses caused by the CloudCME implementation, staffing changes, and reaccreditation.

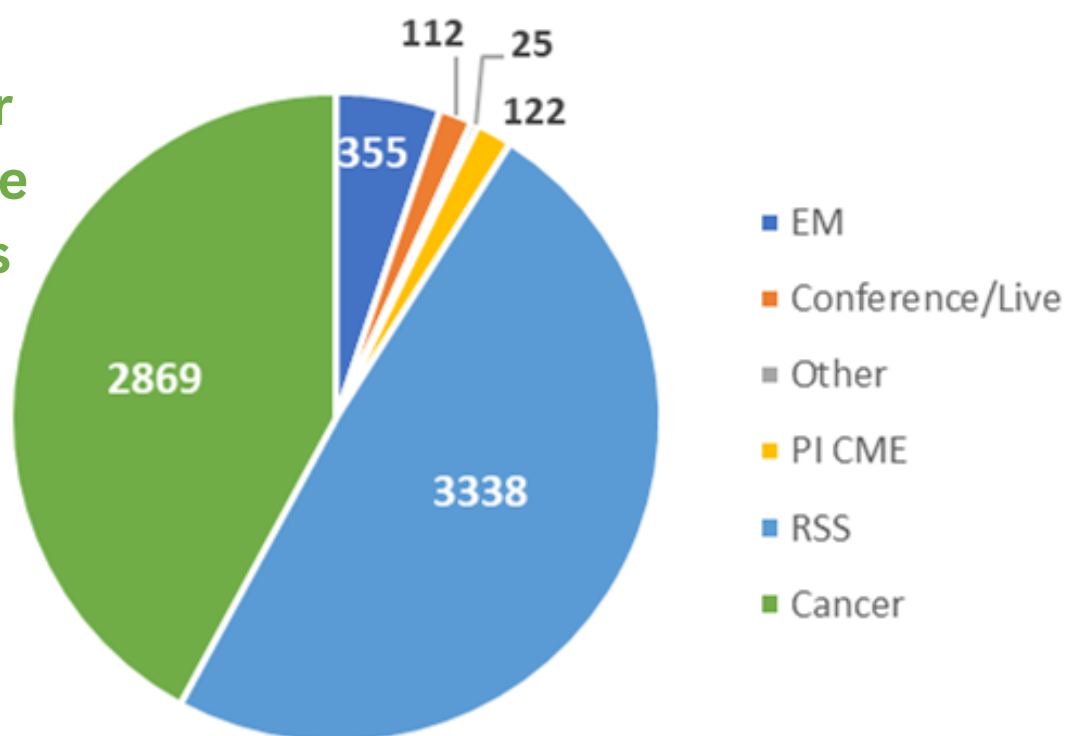


Unique Physicians: **1010**

Unique Non-Physicians: **2437**

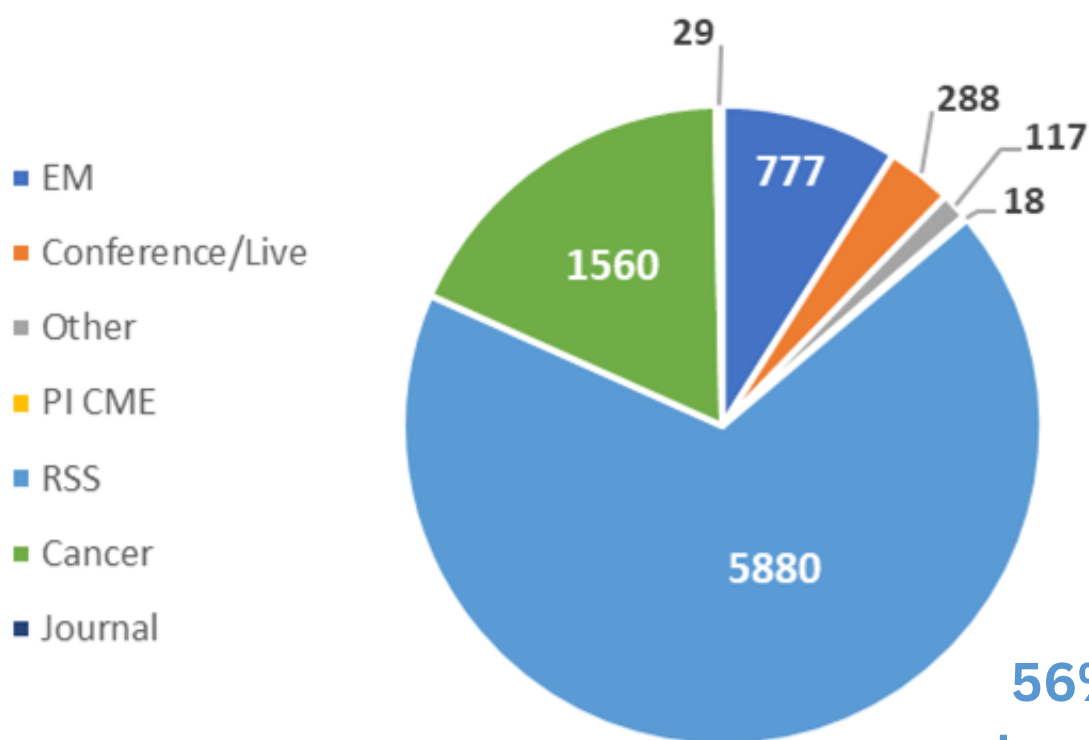
Physician Participation
